| ESSENTIAL VOCABULARY | |
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| Word | Definition |
| Symbols | Something that represents or stands for something else. |
| Sacrament | A religious ceremony sharing God's grace such as Baptism, First Holy Communion. |
| Faith | Belief and trust in God. |
| Ceremonies | A formal occasion to celebrate a particular event |
| Anointing | Smear or rub with oil. |
| Trinity | The three parts of God: God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Spirit. |
| Commitment | Being dedicated to something. |
| Promises | A declaration that one will do something. |
| Rules | One of a set of understood regulations or principles. |
| actions | The fact or process of doing something, typically to achieve an aim. |
| Rite | A religious ceremony or act. |
| Welcome | Greeting someone. |
| Chrism | A mixture of oil and Balsam, consecrated and used for anointing at Baptism. |
