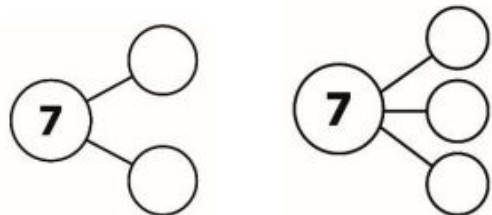
What's the same and what's different?

Both frames have 5 counters. One has 3 yellow and 2 red counters. The other has 3 red and 2 yellow.

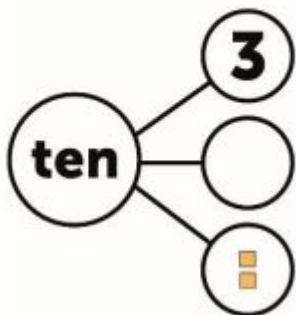

Explore regrouping objects

Provide pupils with two different types of objects, for example: dinosaurs. Ask pupils to pick a total, for example 8, and create as many groups of different dinosaurs as they can with the same total.

I have 5 purple dinosaurs and 3 red ones. There are 8 dinosaurs altogether.

I have 2 red dinosaurs and 6 purple ones. There are 8 dinosaurs altogether.

Ask pupils to pick one of their dinosaur groupings and, using a variety of resources, represent the groups.

These all represent the 5 purple and 3 red dinosaurs. Five and three make eight.
