

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Year 3

We have had a very busy few weeks settling in to year 3! The children have been learning all about the Egyptians in both history and art. We were so lucky to have an Egyptian workshop at school where all the children came dressed up in their best Egyptian costumes. We learnt some great skills such as how to make bread, how to carve soap, made clay Canopic jars and even had a feast where the children took part in role play! It was a fantastic day. The children have also been designing Egyptian scrolls in art. They have been looking at Egyptian symbols and characters and deciding which ones they would like on their final piece that would tell the best story.









Year 4

Year 4 have already got off to a very busy start this term! In our outdoor learning sessions, we have taken our RE learning outdoors. We were drawing our class crosses. This year our cross was the 'Celtic Cross'. In another session, we made stick people and then made up a story about them and the journey they had been on. It was lovely to see some creative and free writing all inspired by some sticks! In another session, we did some acting and performed to the class. We re-enacted the story of Jacob, Esau and Isaac as told in the Bible.







Year 5

Year 5 have been working hard in maths to develop their knowledge of negative numbers and decimals. This week we have been learning about multiplying numbers by 10, 100 or 1000. Our RE topic is ourselves and we have had some good discussions about the qualities and gifts that God has given us. As part of Catholic Social Teaching, we wrote about the importance of caring for God's creation (please see an example below). In music we have been learning an Egyptian theme song about the pyramids and learning about musical notation.

The children showed fantastic team spirit when they took part in the Year 5 fun run with other local schools this week and we even won some medals!



The children have started their swimming sessions in Year 5 and I was really impressed with their progress in the second week.

I think that at Holy Family School we should care for God's beautiful creation, because then the people who will live after us will enjoy it. If everyone does their part then, while we live, we can make the world a better place. If we walk to school, recycle plastic, pick up litter then in we will see a huge difference. Pope Francis said "Hope is not lost for all humans" Whenever people do something together, it may seem they did something very small, like throwing plastic into the ocean, but it causes a huge problem. Please be reminded that there is an 'unofficial' one way system in operation for drop off and pick up time to ease the flow of traffic. All cars should enter Crookhams via the Rowans end, please be aware that members of the public may not be aware of this arrangement and at times this can cause hold ups.
