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Year 3

We have had a very busy few weeks in Year 3! The children have been learning all about forces and magnets in science. This week we conducted an investigation looking at whether materials where magnetic or nonmagnetic. We had lots of fun testing and sorting the materials into groups! Ask us what we found out about our new key words – 'attract' and 'repel'. In outdoor learning we have been making winter wreaths using natural resources. Each one looks completely different

and beautiful. They are proudly on display in the year 3 classroom!





Year 4

Year 4 have been really busy with our learning this half term. We have particularly enjoyed learning about the Romans in history and enjoyed our trip to Verulamium museum. At the museum we had the chance to look at the artefacts and be Romans at the market. We have also practised Roman drills and formations during outdoor learning. In Science we have been investigating circuits and different components. Our outdoor learning helped us to understand how a circuit works when we were components in a whole class circuit. We will use this knowledge when we build torches in design technology. We are thinking about the important time of advent and look forward to celebrating this in different ways.





Year 5

Year 5 have had a busy few weeks! In maths we have been learning to multiply and divide 2 digit numbers. Children have been learning to use expanded noun phrases, simile and personification in their writing. In music this half term we have listened to blues music and learned to play a 12 bar blues. Children used natural materials to make a windchime in our LOTC session. We had our last swimming session this week and the children have been amazing and grown in skills and confidence in the water.





Year 6

In PE we have been developing our gymnastic skills. We have learnt to combine and perform various gymnastic actions smoothly.

During our LOTC lesson, we took time to reflect on our primary school memories for our end-of-year yearbook. It was amazing to look back on all the fun we've had and to think about the exciting things we're looking forward to as we move on to secondary school.


