

Curriculum Information - Year 2

Spring Term 2 2024 – 24th February 2025 -Friday 4th April 2025

Dear Parents/Carers,

Welcome back to the 2nd Spring term. Our topic for this half term is What is a Monarch? Where possible lessons in all curriculum areas will link with this topic but maths and RE will be taught discretely.

English	This term the children will continue to develop their reading skills through spelling lessons and guided reading. We will also have regular handwriting practice. In our English lessons we will begin by focusing on the different features of a non-fiction report before writing our own report about an animal for a class book. The children will be describing the characters and retelling the story. We will then move onto a unit of work where the children will be writing their own narrative before ending the half term with a poetry unit.
Maths	This half term Year 2 will continue to practice core number skills during regular maths fluency sessions. This half term our maths will focus on subtraction as well as developing our understanding of telling them time before moving onto to finding double or half or a 2 digit number. We will then move onto learning about times tables and division.
Science	In Science this half term Year 2's topic is Life cycles and health. The children will learn: To identify different stages of the human life cycle. To know which offspring come from which parent animal. To observe and measure growth in humans. To use simple measuring equipment. To identify and list the basic needs for survival for humans and animals. To use secondary sources to research. To recognise the importance of exercise and personal hygiene. Working scientifically. To make observations over time. To identify how to have a balanced diet.
PE/LOTC	 Working scientifically- To interpret collected results. PE and Learning outside the classroom lessons will continue to happen on a Friday. In our PE lessons the children will be taking part in striking and fielding lessons and learning all the skills required to play a game of cricket or rounder's.
RE	In RE our topic will focus on the theme of Desert to Garden. The children will learn about: That Jesus gave us the Sacrament of Reconciliation to heal and restore our friendship with God and through this ourselves. That Lent is a time of preparing our hearts and minds for Easter through reconciliation and forgiveness. • The Easter Vigil Mass is the high point of the year and is rich in symbols of light and darkness. Celebrate By the end of this unit of study, pupils will know: • Some prayers and actions that are ways in which Catholics turn back to God, in the Sacrament of Reconciliation, for example, a simple Examen or an act of sorrow and in the Penitential rite, for example, the Kyrie Eleison (Lord have Mercy). • Some simple words, actions, and symbols of the Easter Vigil, focusing on light and water. Live By the end of this unit of study, pupils will know: • The importance of saying sorry to God and to others.
	 That prayer can help people say sorry for their sins. That making bad choices damages relationships and damages them.

Humanities Arts History – What is Monarch? The children will learn: Computing To describe what a monarch is. To explain why coronations take place. To explain how William the Conqueror became King of England. To identify how William the Conqueror built castles while ruling England. To identify features of a castle that would be effective when defending against attacks. To suggest what a monarch was like in the past. Art- Painting and mixed media art. The skills we will learn are: To develop knowledge of colour mixing, To know how texture can be created with paint. To use paint to explore texture and pattern. To compose a collage, choosing and arranging materials for effect. To evaluate and improve artwork. Music - In music we will be working on the unit of work called On This Island- British sounds. The skills we will be working on are: To learn about the British Isles through folk music and use music to create seaside sounds. To identify sounds specific for the countryside and create a related soundscape. To engage with city themes through song, soundscape creation and music analysis. To create and perform music compositions inspired by the seaside, countryside or city. To compose and perform a musical piece representing a journey through Britain. Homework will be set every Friday on Google Classroom: **Home Learning** Reading (1 library books and 1 reading book per week) Spelling activity each week and a weekly activity linked to maths or topic work.
