In Year 3 we have had a very exciting couple of weeks back. In Music we have been learning all about Indian music. In Science, we have created leaflets to inform others about the impact that humans have on the environment and what we can do to help. We have also illustrated books about seasonal change. We enjoyed learning about different jobs in careers afternoon. We look forward to the rest of our learning this half term.







Year 5

Year 5 have been enjoying our English units on developing an advert and using persuasive language. The children designed a new product and had to write a print advert and make a video advert as well as a Dragon's Den pitch. In RE we have been learning some key information about the Bible such as who wrote it and the difference between the Old and New Testament. In music, this week we have started learning the songs for our summer production called School of Pop and it is sounding great already! In outdoor learning children looked for patterns and sequences in nature. The children also created some amazing and expressive self-portraits in art.

We were delighted to welcome Bart Gee to our school. Bart, shared his powerful story of perseverance and faith with our pupils.

Despite being told he would never walk or play music, Bart has learned to do both and now travels the country inspiring others. He even performed a beautiful piece on the piano, showing what can be achieved with determination and a positive attitude.
