Word	Definition
Angels	Messengers from God.
Annunciation	When the Angel Gabriel told Mary that God wanted her to be Jesus' mother.
Bible	A sacred book that contains the word of God.
Gloria	A Christian hymn to praise God.
Hail Mary	A special prayer to Mary.
Jesus	The Son of God.
Visitation	When Mary visits her cousin Elizabeth.
