



Curriculum Information - Year 6

Autumn Term 1 – Wednesday 3rd September - Friday 24th October

Dear Parents/Carers,

English	<p>We will be starting the school year with a whole school project based on the book: 'The Tree and the River' by Aaron Becker, Poetry, a short narrative, annotated drawings of hopes for the future.</p> <p>After this, children will write a short story inspired by other mystery and suspense short stories - narrative unit featuring – 'The Night of the Gargoyles' by Eve Bunting; 'The Mysteries of Harris Burdick' by Chris Van Allsburg.</p> <p>We will then look at the Planetarium, we complete some non-chronological writing based on this book.</p> <p>Our Class novel is October, October</p>
Maths	<p>Our maths learning this half term will focus on: e.g. place value, multiplying and dividing by 10/100/1000, choosing effective mental calculation strategies, problem solving with the 4 operations and application of factors, multiples and prime numbers, formal method for multiplication, area of parallelograms and triangles, formal written method for short division.</p>
Science	<p>Our science topic this half term is: Living things: Classifying Big and Small. Children broaden their knowledge of how vertebrates, invertebrates, plants and micro-organisms are grouped using shared characteristics. They discover how Carl Linnaeus developed the Linnaean and binomial systems for classifying and naming living things. Pupils use and produce branching and number classification keys to sort and identify organisms.</p>
PE	<p>This half term we will be looking at: Football</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • I can create and use space to help my team. • I can dribble, pass, receive and shoot the ball with increasing control under pressure. • I can select the appropriate action for the situation and make this decision quickly. • I can use marking, tackling and/or interception to improve my defence. • I can use the rules of the game consistently to play honestly and fairly. • I can work collaboratively to create tactics with my team and evaluate the effectiveness of these. • I recognise my own and others strengths and areas for development and can suggest ways to improve.

Humanities Arts Computing	<p>History- What does the Census tell us about our local area? Investigating local history during the Victorian period, children carry out an enquiry using census and factory records. They learn about the changes to a family over a period of time and suggest reasons for these changes, linking them to national events. Planning their own historical enquiry, they research a local family or street.</p> <p>DT – Textiles: Waistcoats Using a combination of textiles skills such as attaching fastenings, appliqué and decorative stitches, children design, assemble and decorate a waistcoat for a chosen purpose.</p> <p>Computing – Coding on Purple Mash To design and create efficient programs using sequence, selection, repetition and variables.</p> <p>Music – Dynamics, pitch and tempo (Theme: Fingal's Cave) Appraising the work of Mendelssohn and further developing improvisation and composition skills.</p> <p>French - Fruits and Vegetables - Les fruits Name and recognise up to 10 fruits in French, attempt to spell some of these nouns, ask somebody in French if they like a particular fruit, say what fruits they like and dislike.</p> <p>RSE- Begins in Autumn 2</p>
Home Learning	<p>Daily Reading – 20 minutes (BoomReader to be updated)</p> <p>Weekly spellings</p> <p>Google Classroom – activity set by class teacher</p> <p>Times Tables Rock Stars – 20 minutes 3x per week</p> <p>Share the weekly Wednesday word Gospel reading with your child. Use the discussion questions to talk about the Gospel reading.</p>
