



Curriculum Information – Year 4

Autumn Term 4th September- October 20th 2023

Half term 23rd October-27th October 2023

Dear Parents/Carers,

We will be covering a range of subject areas this half term as outlined below.

English	<p>Our term starts with the children across the whole school taking part in a project studying the text “Coming to England” by Floella Benjamin. After this we move on to our first year topic, which will be “Roman myths”. We will look at a range of texts within this unit such as “Gods and Goddesses of Mount Olympus” by Marcia Williams and the “Ancient Myths Collection” by Geraldine McCaughrean and Tony Ross. This unit is aimed at addressing key skills linked to grammar and sentence construction, ensuring that essential prior learning is embedded. Children will plan and write a short myth that contains gods, goddesses, mythical creatures and a moral teaching. Before the end of term, the children will spend a few weeks undertaking a local history study and producing their own information text about Welwyn Garden City. This will enable them to understand the features of a non-fiction text and write in a different style.</p> <p>Spelling sessions:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none">1. Review r controlled vowel sounds from KS12. Review Year 2 common exception words and other high frequency words3. Review vowel suffixes4. Review vowel suffixes -y, -er, est to create adjectives:5. Review consonant suffixes -ment, -ness , -ful, -less <p>Our class book this term is ‘Romans on the Rampage’ by Jeremy Strong.</p>
Maths	<p>Our maths learning this half term will focus on: place value – ordering and comparing numbers beyond 1000, securing addition and subtracting mental fluency, securing formal written methods for addition and subtraction, counting in multiples of 6,7,9, 25 and 1000 as well as carrying out a range of problems solving, including problems involving measures. We will learn about multiplying and dividing a one or two-digit numbers by 10 and 100</p>

	<p>and how to solve problems involving mental strategies, place value and the Arithmetic Laws.</p> <p>Times table practise will take place several times a week to ensure children are confident at recalling their 2,5,10, 3, 4 and 8 times table before progressing to learning and securing both multiplication and division facts for the 6,7,9,11 and 12s times tables.</p>
Science	<p>Our main Science topic this half term is sound. Children will Identify how sounds are made, associating some of them with something vibrating</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Recognise that vibrations from a sound travel through a medium to the ear. • Find patterns between the pitch of a sound and features of the object that produced it • Find patterns between the volume of a sound and the strength of the vibrations that produced it. • Recognise that sounds get fainter as the distance from the sound source increases.
PE	<p>P.E day: Thursday (please ensure your child's comes to school in the correct PE kit). Only stud earrings please, no hoops.</p> <p>Tag rugby is our first topic this term. During which time, they will learn the following skills:</p> <p><u>Tag Rugby</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> -To develop ball handling skills demonstrating increasing control and accuracy. -To develop throwing, catching and running with the ball -To develop an understanding of tagging rules. -To begin to use the 'forward pass' and 'off side' rule. -To be able to support a teammate when attacking. -To be able to dodge a defender and move into space when running towards the goal. -To develop defending skills and use them in a game situation. - To be able to apply the rules and tactics you have learnt and play in a tag rugby tournament.

(Recorded on Boom Reader) • Purple Mash – activity set by class teacher • Times Tables Rock Stars – 15 minutes 3x per week <p>Share the weekly Wednesday word Gospel reading with your child. Complete the age appropriate activities.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • From time to time, there may be extended homework set where the hand in time will range between 2-4 weeks depending on workload.

A few reminders:

- Please bring a named water bottle every day.
- Please ensure your child is equipped for all weathers as the Autumn term can prove to be quite unpredictable at times! Please ensure all items of clothing brought into school are named. There will be more lessons carried out outdoors so please bring a rain jacket/coat just in case the weather turns in the day.
- Please listen to your child read as much as possible in the week as well as reading out loud to your child. More information regarding reading books will follow.
