Timeline	A picture to show a period of time on which important events are marked
Chronology	The arrangements of events in the order in which they happened
Object	A thing that can be seen and touched
Similar	The ways in which objects are the same
Different	The ways in which things are not the same

Key Learning

- You can find out about the recent past by talking to your grandparents. We call this oral history.
- You can find out what life was like in the recent past through looking at photographs or **objects**.
- Many toys today are similar to those played with by grandparents.
- ☐ Toys today are usually made from **different** materials than in the past, for example plastic instead of wood or metal.
- □ Some grandparents didn't have the electronic toys you have today.
- ☐ Shops today are usually much bigger than when some grandparents were children. We call them supermarkets..
- Some grandparents mainly learned about the 3 'Rs' reading, writing and arithmetic. You learn about lots of different subjects.

Century is one hundred years

A month has 4 weeks.

There are 12 months in a year.
