

Useful Information

Important things to know

- Geographers go on journeys to cities, countries and continents. Many animals do too!
- The continents' names are: Asia, Oceania, Europe, Antarctica, North America and South America.
- Around each continent are seas and oceans. These are the Arctic, Southern, Pacific, Atlantic and Indian.
- Some people live near to precious land animals, but we don't always care for wildlife like we should. What we do makes a difference.
- Penguins and elephants are amazing. Their natural habitat is not in the UK, but you may see them in a zoo.
- 6. African elephants eat plants, can live a long time and are the largest land animal.
- Small sharks live in the sea around the UK. Even whale sharks, which are the size of a bus and live around Australia in Oceania, are harmless to us.
- Birds called swallows fly across the world. They fly over land, eating and drinking as they go, often not stopping until they reach the south of Africa.
